


### School Site Action Plan

#### Part A (15 points)

Review the list of ideas that you brainstormed so far. Prioritize the list and decide on a few action projects that you can do to improve your site. Make a list of your top three choices here:

#### Part B (25 points)

Review the School Site Investigation Project Action Plan Assessment Rubric and create your Action Plan. Your Action Plan must address the following issues:

- a. **Stated Goal** – What will your action plan accomplish? A clearly-stated purpose of your action plan.
- b. **Cost Analysis and Feasibility** – How much will it cost (in terms of resources like time, money, manpower, materials, etc.) to make your action plan happen? Have you considered the probability that your Action Plan will work? Have you considered that you can make your Action Plan work?
- c. **Implementation Plan** – How will you execute your Action Plan? What are some steps or actions that you will need to take to make your Action Plan a reality or to accomplish your Stated Goal?
- d. **Maintenance and Sustainability** – How will the goal of your project be maintained or sustained? For example, if your action plan is to build a butterfly garden, how will the garden be maintained? Who will take care of it? How will you ensure the long-term viability of your project (for example, a butterfly garden) Etc.?
- e. **Data** – Your Action Plan must be supported by data collected for the School Site Investigation Project.

#### Part C (25 points)

Create a poster that summarizes your Action Plan. Poster paper will be provided by your Science teacher. Poster must be neat, colorful, visually-appealing, and artistically-creative. Refer to the School Site Investigation Project Action Plan Assessment Rubric.

#### Part D (25 points)

Create a presentation to sell your Action Plan. Refer to the School Site Investigation Project Presentation Rubric from ELA.
